



## JUNIOR SQUASH BRONZE EVENTS

**Dunlop Bronze** events are an excellent way to introduce new young players to the game of squash. A bronze event can be the catalyst to starting and sustaining an active junior program in your club. And these junior players are your future adult members.

We are very pleased to provide you with a template of a successful Dunlop Bronze event format which has been developed by Jim Paton, Head Squash Professional at Toronto's Granite Club.

Please feel free to use this format and we encourage you to send us innovations of your own which you have found successful and which you'd like to share with programmers across the province. We'll post these under our 'Best Practices' on our Business of Squash website.

### Planning your Bronze Event

In order to host a sanctioned Dunlop Bronze event, you must have **at least one or two sister clubs** involved to run a home and away at all clubs if possible. A **minimum** would be two events at two of the three clubs. Clubs not following this format **are not eligible** for the Dunlop prizes.

Please note that in order to ensure all member facilities have an opportunity to host a Dunlop bronze event, clubs will be limited to one bronze event per season.

Participating clubs must commit to bringing a minimum of eight players to the sister club.

The Junior Bronze sanction event fee is \$10.00 (payable by Visa/MasterCard only). Once your event is sanctioned, you will receive the following from Squash Ontario:

- ✓ 6 balls
- ✓ 10 Dunlop t-shirts to be used as prizes or draw prizes
- ✓ Event poster/flyer and website posting

# DUNLOP JUNIOR SQUASH BRONZE EVENTS

Squash Ontario is pleased to provide a suggested format for Junior Squash Bronze Events – it is for children who are relatively new to squash but who have some understanding of the game. **“FUN”** is the key word!

## **A Suggested Format**

### **An Introduction to the Game {6- 12 year olds} – approximate time – 4 hours**

- An introduction of children into the squash environment
- Encourage structured play on the squash court
- *Focus on developing the fundamental movement skills (e.g., running, hitting, rallying)*
- *Emphasis on fundamental movement skills linked together into active plays*

#### **To begin:**

**Registration Cost:** \$20 to \$30 – Try to keep as low as possible to encourage participation

**Player Registration:** 11:45 a.m.

**Play:** 12:20 – 4:20 p.m.

**Break:** 2:15 – 2:30 {fresh fruit and small fun skills challenge}

**Dinner and Door Prizes:** 4:30 p.m.

#### **Format:**

- » 5 to 6 kids per court grouped by age/level
- » Most common age 6 – 12
- » Kids should be able to get serve in most of the time and have a basic understanding of how to play a game of squash
- » Focus-----Sportsmanship, FUN, social, learning how to play a real game and how to referee
- » Kids play a round robin against each other kid in their group, one game up to 13 points
- » "Players learn to referee (with help from more experienced junior volunteers
- » Referees hand in score sheet (and receive a rubber fun figure or some crazy little reward) and the pro keeps track of the wins/losses in each group
- » At 2:25 break, adjust the groups (like a ladder – 2 go up and 2 go down)
- » At 4:30, dinner and big prizes in a draw

**Key Points:**

Have some fun giveaways for the first half for the refs to get. This makes it very fun for them. They must take turns refereeing so the prizes are shared.

[www.orientaltrading.com](http://www.orientaltrading.com) is a great site to order from. Have lots of fun door prizes with one big one! Source out a sponsor to donate Blue Jays and Leafs tickets or tickets to local amusement places - the kids love that. Start with smaller door prizes (collect good deals throughout the year at sales) and end with the big one. When someone wins then they are out of the draw and you continue on to the last Grand Prize!

Have a fun dinner too. Chicken fingers with fries and make your own ice cream sundaes. Serve water so that saves a bit too.
